- Implement the Preliminary Electoral Results Program for Mexico City elections, in accordance with the Election Regulations and other guidelines issued by INE.
- Conduct dissemination campaigns in various media and social networks, explaining the concept of non-party candidacies and the procedure to collect the support of citizens prior to and during the period of collection of such support.
- Determine the partial or total use of electronic voting systems in electoral processes to receive and compute the votes of the citizens of Mexico City, including those residing abroad, based on the certainty and security measures it deems pertinent and, if applicable, on the parameters established for electoral processes by the LGIPE and the INE through its agreement.

Established in Article 111 of the LEGIPE and Article 179 of the Mexico City Code of Electoral Institutions and Procedures:

- Submit and resolve, in a final and unassailable manner, disputes submitted to its jurisdiction, through the following means of challenge and trials:
- Lawsuits related to the elections of the head of government, the deputies of the Congress of Mexico City and the members of the municipalities.
- Lawsuits to safeguard the political-electoral rights of citizens, against the determinations of local electoral authorities, as well as political associations.
- Verifying that the acts and resolutions of the electoral and citizen participation authorities are in accordance with the Local Constitution, the Electoral Law, the procedural law and this Code.

● **Allocation of public funding for each of the positions:**

By means of the IECM/ACU-CG-002/2024 Agreement dated 5 January 2024, the General Council of the Electoral Institute of Mexico City determined the public funding for the support of the ordinary permanent activities and specific activities of political parties as entities of public interest for the 2024 fiscal year, as well as for campaign expenses of political parties and non-party candidates to be exercised in the 2023-2024 Ordinary Local Electoral Process, as follows:

Prerogatives for parties and candidates

It is worth mentioning that the General Law on Political Parties in its Article 51, paragraph 1, subsection b), section I, states that in the year of the election in which the federal or local Executive Power and the two Chambers of the Congress of the Union or the Chamber of a federal entity are renewed, each national or local political party, respectively, will be granted for campaign expenses an amount equivalent to fifty percent of the public funding that corresponds to it for the support of its permanent ordinary activities in that year.

And that once the arithmetic operation referred to in numeral 1 of article 51 of the General Law of Political Parties has been performed to determine the funding for obtaining votes in



electoral campaigns, which results from multiplying the amounts approved for ordinary public funding by 0.50, resulting in the amounts mentioned above.

It is worth mentioning that the Electoral Institute of Mexico City allocates public funding to political parties, not to each of the candidates for elected office.

Now, regarding the non-party candidacies that obtained their registration to participate in the 2023-2024 Ordinary Local Electoral Process, by means of Agreement IECM/ACU-CG-083/2024 of March 29, 2024, the General Council of the Electoral Institute of Mexico City determined the distribution of public funding for campaign expenses, as follows:

● **Limits on private funding contributions:**

In accordance with IECM/ACU-CG-004/2024 Agreement of 5 January 2024, the General Council of the Electoral Institute of Mexico City approved the limits on private funding contributions that political parties may receive from their activists, supporters, candidates, as well as the individual limit on contributions from individuals during the 2024 financial year, which in its operative paragraphs approved the following:

“FIRST. The limits on private funding contributions that political parties may receive from their activists, supporters and candidates are approved, as well as the individual limit on contributions from individuals during the 2024 fiscal year, in accordance with the considerations of this Agreement.

SECOND. The total annual limit of private financial contributions in cash for the 2024 fiscal year that political parties may receive will be the liquid amount of \$27,739,876.66 (Twenty-seven million seven hundred and thirty-nine thousand eight hundred and seventy-six pesos 66/100 M.N.).



THIRD. The limit of monetary contributions that each political party may receive in the 2024 financial year for contributions from militants will be the liquid amount of \$10,749,702.74 (Ten million seven hundred and forty-nine thousand seven hundred and two pesos 74/100 M.N.).

While the annual limit of individual contributions that can be made by the militancy will be determined by the internal body responsible for managing the funding of each political party, without exceeding the limit of 2% of the public funding granted to all political parties for the support of their ordinary activities in 2024.

FOURTH. The annual limit of monetary contributions that each political party may receive during the 2024 financial year for contributions from supporters and candidates will be the liquid amount of \$3,025,950.48 (Three million twenty-five thousand nine hundred and fifty pesos 48/100 M.N.).

The annual limit of individual monetary contributions that each political party may receive from supporters during the 2024 financial year shall be the net amount of \$151,297.52 (One hundred and fifty-one thousand two hundred and ninety-seven pesos 52/100 M.N.).

FIFTH. The total annual limit of private funding contributions in kind that each political party may receive during the 2024 fiscal year will be the equivalent of the amount of \$27,739,876.66 (Twenty-seven million seven hundred and thirty-nine thousand eight hundred and seventy-six pesos 66/100 M.N.).

SIXTH. The limit that each political party may receive during the 2024 fiscal year for contributions in real estate from the persons authorised to do so shall be the equivalent of the amount of \$12,945,275.77 (Twelve million nine hundred and forty-five thousand two hundred and seventy-five pesos 77/100 M.N.).

SEVENTH. The limit that each political party may receive during the 2024 financial year for contributions in movable and consumable goods from the persons authorised to do so shall be the equivalent of the amount of \$5,547,975.33 (Five million five hundred and forty-seven thousand nine hundred and seventy-five pesos 33/100 M.N.).

EIGHTH. Regardless of the limits expressed in the previous points, the sum of the private funding of the political parties, under all its modalities, including self-funding and financial yields, in no case can be higher than the amount of public funding for the support of their permanent ordinary activities, for their campaign and specific expenses determined by this General Council.

NINTH. In the case of political parties not entitled to receive public funding for the support of permanent ordinary activities, the annual limit of contributions, both in cash and in kind, which



they may receive from private funding, shall be equivalent to 15% of the amount granted to the political party with the largest funding in 2024, which amounts to \$27,739,876.66 (Twenty-seven million seven hundred and thirty-nine thousand eight hundred and seventy-six pesos 66/100 M.N.). ...”

The aforementioned in accordance with article 345, sections I, III and IV; 347 of the Code, sections I, III, IV, V, VI, VII and VII of the Mexico City Code of Electoral Institutions and Procedures, which establish the amounts and percentages that the bodies mentioned in the agreement may carry out.

In accordance with IECM/ACU-CG-084/2024 Agreement of 29 March 2024, the General Council of the Electoral Institute of Mexico City approved the global and individual limits of the contributions of private funding that may be received by non-party candidates who obtained their registration in the Ordinary Local Electoral Process 2023-2024, which approved the following in its operative points:

“FIRST. The global and individual limits of the contributions of private funding that may be received by the non-party candidacies that obtained their registration in the 2023-2024 Ordinary Local Electoral Process are approved.

SECOND: The following is determined as the **overall limit of private funding**, in cash or in kind, that non-party candidates may receive during the campaign period in the Electoral Process:

THIRD. The following is determined as the **individual limit of contributions**, in money or in kind, that **non-party candidates** may **receive from their supporters** during the campaign period of the Electoral Process:

FOURTH. The following is determined as the **individual limit of contributions**, in cash or in kind, **that each non-party candidacy may contribute to its own campaign** in the Electoral Process:

The aforementioned in accordance with Article 322, second paragraph of the Mexico City Code of Electoral Institutions and Procedures, which establishes that private financing is constituted by the contributions made by the non-party candidate and his or her supporters, which may in no case exceed ten percent of the expenditure ceiling for the election in question.

Likewise, in accordance with the provisions of Article 56, paragraph 2, subsection d) of the General Law on Political Parties, in relation to the criteria of the Superior Chamber of the Electoral Tribunal of the Judiciary of the Federation in the case SUP-JDC-222/2018, the individual limit of contributions that supporters may make to non-party candidacies will be equivalent to 0.5 percent of the current spending limit for the campaign in question.

In accordance with jurisprudence 10/2019 entitled: "INDEPENDENT CANDIDATURES. CRITERIA FOR DEFINING THE LIMIT OF PRIVATE FUNDING, which identified the overall amounts of private funding that non-party candidates may receive for the Electoral Process in question, based on the difference between the campaign expenditure ceiling and the public campaign funding that will correspond to them.

Similarly, in accordance with the criterion upheld in SUP-REC-193/2015, in which it recognised that the constitutional principle of prevalence of public over private financing is aimed at regulating the financing of political parties and not the financing of non-party candidacies, given that the purpose is to safeguard the principle of fairness in the competition provided for in Article 41 of the Federal Constitution and there are clear differences between the two types of parties.
