Prerogatives for parties and candidates

It is worth mentioning that the General Law on Political Parties in its Article 51, paragraph 1, subsection b), section I, states that in the year of the election in which the federal or local Executive Power and the two Chambers of the Congress of the Union or the Chamber of a federal entity are renewed, each national or local political party, respectively, will be granted for campaign expenses an amount equivalent to fifty percent of the public funding that corresponds to it for the support of its permanent ordinary activities in that year.

• Limits on private funding contributions:

In accordance with agreement CGIEEG/083/2023 dated 14 November 2023, the General Council of the Electoral Institute of the State of Guanajuato approved the limits of private funding that political parties may receive during the 2024th fiscal year from their militants, candidates, and supporters, as well as the individual limit of contributions from supporters.

FIRST. The limit of the contributions that each political party may receive in money or in kind from militants during the year 2024, without exceeding the annual limit of private financing established for each political party in this agreement, amounts to the sum of \$24,177,287.53

(twenty-four million one hundred and seventy-seven thousand two hundred and eighty-seven pesos 53/100 M.N.).

SECOND. The limit of contributions that each political party may receive in cash or in kind from candidates during the year 2024, without exceeding the annual limit of private financing established for each political party in this agreement, amounts to the sum of \$5,877,195.42 (five million eight hundred and seventy-seven thousand one hundred and ninety-five pesos 42/100 M.N.).

THIRD. The limit of contributions that each political party may receive in money or in kind from supporters during the year 2024, without exceeding the annual limit of private financing established for each political party in this agreement, amounts to the sum of \$5,877,195.42 (five million eight hundred and seventy-seven thousand one hundred and ninety-five pesos 42/100 M.N.).

FOURTH. The individual limit of contributions that each political party may receive in money or in kind from sympathisers as an individual limit during the year 2024, amounts to the sum of \$293,859.77 (two hundred and ninety-three thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine pesos 77/100 M.N.).

FIFTH. In terms of recital 11 of this agreement, the limits of private financing that political parties may receive from contributions from militants, candidates, and supporters during the 2024 fiscal year are established as follows:

The aforementioned in accordance with Article 92, section II, of the local electoral law, which indicates that it is the responsibility of the General Council of the Institute to dictate norms and provisions aimed at making effective the provisions of the aforementioned law. Likewise, Article 92, section VII, establishes that this General Council must oversee compliance with the norms regarding private financing.

Likewise, Article 55 of the local electoral law, private financing shall be subject to the following annual limits:

- «I. Amounts contributed by activists: twelve percent of the public funds allotted to political parties in the relevant year to support their regular and pre-campaign operations;
- II. In the case of contributions from candidates and supporters during electoral processes, ten percent of the expenditure ceiling for the immediately preceding gubernatorial election, to be used in the campaigns of their candidates;
- III. The voluntary and individual contributions that pre-candidates and candidates make solely for their pre-campaigns and campaigns, as well as the minimum and maximum amounts and the frequency of the ordinary and extraordinary contributions of their militants, shall be freely determined by each political party through the capable internal body of the political parties, and
- IV. Individual contributions from supporters shall be limited to 0.5 percent of the expenditure ceiling for the immediately preceding gubernatorial election on an annual basis. »
