# Candidate selection mechanism

For the nomination of candidates, each government branch brought together three recognised legal professionals into evaluation committees to receive the applicants' files, assess their compliance with the constitutional and legal requirements, and identify those best-evaluated in the necessary technical knowledge to hold office and of reputable honesty, competence, and academic and professional background in the legal profession. The Evaluation Committees met, in turn, as the State Evaluation

	Gender equality in the nomination of candidates.
Participation of specific groups	The Political Constitution of the Free and Sovereign State of Tlaxcala (CPELST) and Tlaxcala's Law on Electoral Institutions and Procedures (LIPEET), establish that the State Congress, the Government Branches' Evaluation Committees, and —where appropriate—the State Evaluation Committee will issue the official calls for any citizen to take part in the 2024–2025 Extraordinary Local Electoral Process to renew elective offices of the Judiciary, the Court of Administrative Justice and the Court of Conciliation and Arbitration (PELEPJ 2024-2025), in which the participation of women and men in all vacancies must be guaranteed. The LIPEET provides that the State's Government Branches will approve the lists of candidates standing for office at the 2024–2025 PELEPJ. Hence, gender equality is observed when these lists are built on an equal basis —fifty percent of the nominations for women and fifty percent for men— except for when a higher percentage of women is mandated for the flexible optimisation of gender equality.  Therefore, the proportion of men and women in the lists of candidates standing for all the elective offices of the 2024–2025 PELEPJ —per subject or specialisation (as applicable) and territorial scope— will be equal. Consequently, should there be lists of candidates made up of only men, the constitutional principle of gender equality would be infringed.  The nominations of the incumbents taking part in the 2024–2025 PELEPJ will not be considered for the enforcement of gender equality.  Should a woman candidate die, be incapacitated or disqualified, or withdraw, she must be replaced by another woman. Should the candidate be a man, he may be replaced by a woman.  Accordingly, the Local EMB approved —through its Agreement ITE-CG 11-2025— the criteria to uphold the constitutional principle of gender equality in the 2024–2025 Extraordinary Local Electoral Process to renew elective offices of the Judiciary, the Court of Administrative Justice and the Court of Conciliation and Arbitration 2024-2025, which can be
